Update re:School Dress Codes- Tasha Diamant continues to support the efforts of school trustee Jordan Watters, who is pushing for the development of regulations and/or administrative guidelines for the creation, review and enforcement of school dress codes in order to ensure that any dress codes in our district reflect the school board's commitment to gender equity in both intention and practice, and that they are in alignment with Policy 4303 Discrimination. They feel that the wording of dress codes can result in body shaming against girls and that they put all of the responsibility on girls rather than setting an expectation of respectful behaviour from boys and men.
