Administration's Report	<ul> <li>Christine         <ul> <li>Kiosk is lacking some emergency supplies: Cassie and Jen Hill are working on this</li> <li>We should consider getting a container – Christine will contact the municipality to see if they could help with supplies that could also be used by the community in an emergency</li> <li>Discussion about possibly extending lunch time to 1 hour instead of the current 25 minutes: this would allow for more playtime and practice time for band and sports, this would increase the school day – further discussion to take place about this</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Elaine</li> <li>What full lock down would look like: children need to sit quietly in designated areas and nobody moves, parents are NOT allowed in the school and unlikely allowed on school grounds</li> <li>Hold and Secure (More likely to occur) all exterior doors would be closed and nobody would be allowed in or out – kids would be allowed to move around the classroom</li> <li>RE-unification Drill: in the event of an emergency it is best for kids to be back with their parents – the school needs to be prepared to have the kids for up to</li> </ul>

The school needs to make sure the kids go to the right person as per the forms completed by parents at the beginning of the year.  2 of step- Social emotional program: this is happening in the classrooms. Kids are learning to stay focused and talking about empathy. Some terminology used is "Stop, name your feelings, calm down." There are special assemblies throughout the year regarding 2nd step.  Playground is going well: "go play"  Ordered playground equipment. Offering Soccer& cross country  Rocks and Rings: curling association comes to teach the kids: 4th year running  Would like to consider tennis for this year  Young entrepreneurs (grades 4/5): district is promoting career choices especially in trades. Host a career panel in conjunction with Red Seal: 5-6 trades' people come in and there is an assembly where the kids can ask the trades people questions.  Numeracy is a big goal: If the kids are at a grade 3 level in reading by the end of grade 3 they have a better chance of success in the future  Inclusive education instead of special education: includes all students in as many ways as possible.
