- d. Cycling BC HopOn Program (Program Fee increase from \$1200 to \$2200)
  - 1. Capital Bike ran bike skill lessons for grade 4 and 5's which was well done and well received. Capital Bike program had no cost to the school or PAC.
  - 2. HopOn is more focused on learning to ride. Capital Bike emphasis was on road safety.
  - 3. Suggestion is to skip HopOn on this year because of the Capital Bike program. We have agreed to skip it this year.
  - 4. Will reassess next year.
- e. McTavish Art Academy Tiffany

  - 2. We will pick up bottles at request from neighbourhood
  - 3. All the bottles from the bottle bin go into a reserve fund. Bottle bin isn't being sorted by the PAC this year. We get 50% of proceeds when the Bottle Depot picks up but there are not enough volunteers to sort it ourselves.

  - 1. We don't have a coordinator yet for this year
  - 2. Our logo was updated last year
  - 3. Tanya would be happy to create a couple options for us to look at. Will look into updating the logo and undertake new design and products next year.
  - 4. This year will stay with the same logo and options as last year.
