nutritious and also provides students an opportunity to experience different fruits and vegetables throughout the year.

#### 7. New Items Discussion

- a. PAC Bylaws
  - 1. A draft of the PAC Bylaws to be shared in the next newsletter and posted to our website for review and comment by parents
  - 2. We need to approve the bylaws at our next meeting
- b. Emergency Supplies
  - 1. \$2 from each family and goes towards buying water and a granola bar to be used in emergency situations when kids will stay at school longer than a normal school day
  - 2. One of our goals for this year is to inventory our supplies in the Sea-Can to know what we may need to purchase. Cara, Brett and some volunteers will be going through this

- c. Division reps
  - 1. Each division needs a representative to support communication between the parents and the PAC.
  - 2. Please volunteer online or sign up with the form that was sent home.
- d. Fall GoByBike Weeks: October 16-29
  - 1. Students will receive a sticker, button or other small item when they participate in biking to school each day this week. Parent volunteers will hand out items in the morning before school.
- e. Classroom Enrichment Funds
  - \$100 per class to support teachers and students. Mostly used for art supplies, kits and other items that are not included in the District budget.

  - 1. Last year: \$10 per student from Gaming Grant. Then in January we gave an additional \$15 per student from PAC funds for a total of \$5600. Not every class used all of their funds.

- a. Hiring is complete! We have a grade 4 /5 Div 3 teacher Ms. Vandella Burn. Anya will co-teach with her to get her settled.
- b. Bruce Watts is our new school counsellor.
- c. Kaylene Bell to cover Ms Walker's class on Wednesdays in Div 7
- d. New night custodian Brian Garretson and returning Osiris and Jim. Cleanliness has improved.
- e. Cross country started today 40 kids started. Lake Hill is participating in the first meet at Beckwith Park on Tues Sept 26th. Grades 3-5 can participate.
- f. Capital Bike Oct 4th &6th Bike safety course for Grades 4 & 5's.
- g. The school received \$15k from the provincial government called Feeding Futures. Brett & Jen will decide what the most effective way will be to support families with food costs. Brett wants to protect the dignity of families and he is hoping to get gift cards from grocery stores that families can use to purchase groceries.
- h. The school is painting a mural in the library hallway. Brett will purchase some paint. School staff and students will be painting.
